Infer

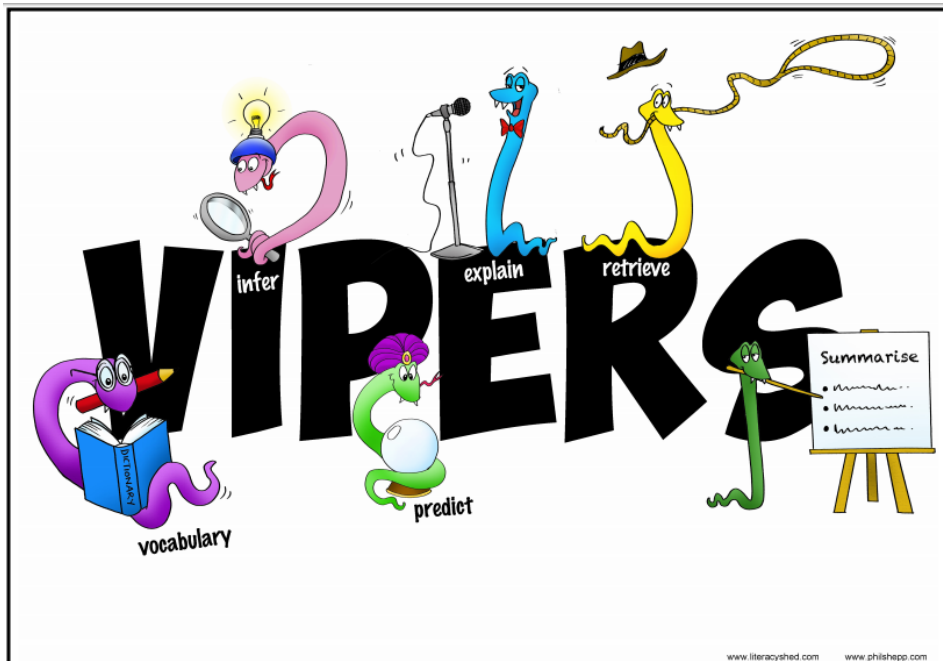
Predict

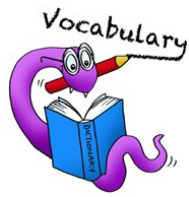
Explain

Which word in this section do you think is the most important? Why?

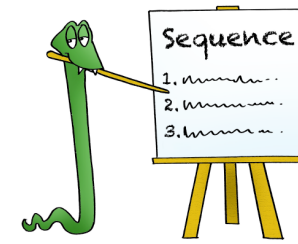
Which of the words best describes the character/setting/mood etc?

What happened after

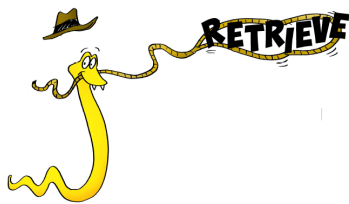
What was the first thing that happened in the story?

Look at the front cover/blurb. What do you think this book is all about? What characters do you think might be in this story? Why?

What do you think will happen next? What makes you think this?

Is there something about the character or setting that could help you to guess what is going to happen?

How do you think the character will feel about that?

What do you think.....will say about that?

Does the last paragraph/sentence tell you anything that could help you to predict what will happen next?

How do you think the story will end? Why?



Is this fiction or non-fiction? How do you know?

What do you already know about the topic of this book? Does the topic remind you of anything you have seen/done?

Can you put what you've just read into your own words?

Would you like to go to this setting? Why/why not?

What would you have done if you were the character?

Has anything like this ever happened to you?

Does it remind you of something?

How would you have felt if that happened to you?

Do you know someone like this character?

How are you like/different than this character?

Who is your favourite character? Why?

What was your favourite part of the book? Why?

Did you like this text? Why/why not?
